They shape not only how we learn – but how we lead.

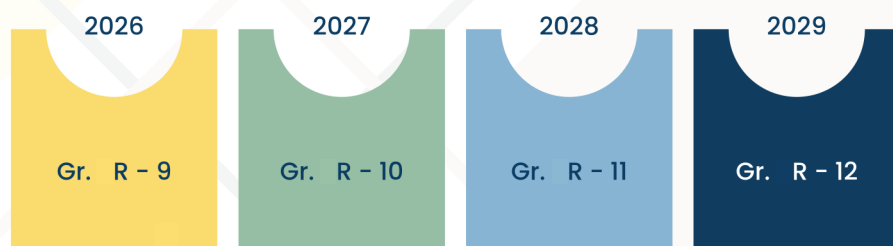


Our Academic Model

At Randburg Independent School, academic excellence is just the starting point.

We deliver an enriched CAPS-aligned NSC curriculum, enhanced by advanced digital tools, entrepreneurial thinking, and future-focused vocational exposure.

Our dual-pathway model prepares learners for both university and employment – with the confidence to thrive in either.



Our Primary School (Grade R – 7)

The Primary Phase at Randburg Independent School is where creativity meets coding, and character meets collaboration.

We follow the CAPS curriculum, enhanced with real-world problem-solving, project-based learning, and exposure to digital tools that prepare learners to thrive in a connected world.

Key Features of Our Primary Phase

1. Integrated & Interdisciplinary Learning

Subjects are not taught in isolation. Our approach connects mathematics, sciences, languages, and the arts into meaningful, cross-disciplinary themes and experiences.

2. Coding & Robotics from Day One

Learners begin exploring logic, sequencing, coding games, and programmable robotics to build computational thinking early on.

3. Digital Creation & Exploration

With guided access to age-appropriate tools, learners begin creating videos, presentations, interactive media, and digital stories – not just consuming them.

4. Entrepreneurial Mindset

We introduce learners to basic business concepts, teamwork, financial literacy, and innovative thinking through class-based ventures and market days.

5. Bridging the Gap

Learners transitioning from traditional schools receive dedicated academic and emotional support to ensure they settle, catch up, and thrive.

6. Assessment Philosophy

We prioritise project-based learning, portfolio development, and creative demonstration of understanding – minimising the stress of constant formal exams.

Our High School

Senior Phase Grade 8 and Grade 9

At Randburg Independent School, the Senior Phase is a time of intensification – where skills are sharpened, futures are explored, and learners start becoming who they're meant to be.

We continue delivering the CAPS curriculum, but with deeper integration of technology, entrepreneurship, and real-world relevance.

What Sets Our Senior Phase Apart?

1. Advanced Digital Skills

FET Pathways Launching from 2027

Our future-ready model empowers learners to follow a path aligned with their skills, purpose, and ambitions.

Starting in 2027, Randburg Independent School will offer a dual-pathway FET phase (Grades 10 - 12), structured around three powerful options:

1. NSC – National Senior Certificate

A strong academic route aligned to the CAPS curriculum, offering access to university, further study, and professional careers.

Ideal for learners pursuing academic excellence and leadership careers.

2. NCV – National Certificate (Vocational)

A practical alternative for learners who thrive in applied, career-based learning.

Combines core academics with vocational training and workplace readiness.

Suitable for learners who want a direct route into the job market or further vocational training.

3. QCTO / Occupational Qualifications

Industry-specific qualifications preparing learners for trades, careers, and entrepreneurship.

Supports learners who wish to launch their own ventures or enter employment straight after school.

Application Procedures

How To Apply For Enrolment

Application forms are available at Randburg Independent School.

An application form must be completed. All fields must be filled in and all supporting documents attached in order to process the application.

The following supporting documentation must accompany the application:

- Copy of the student's birth certificate or ID.
- Copies of both parents' IDs. Should someone else be responsible for the school fees, their ID should be included.
- Copy of parents or legal guardians' IDs.
- Where possible, proof of residential address that is not older than three months.
- Copy of student's previous report.
- Consent-to-process-personal-information form.

Application Procedures

Non-South African Citizens

Non-South African citizens whose parents are in possession of a permit for temporary or permanent residence issued by the Department of Home Affairs, or whose parents have been recognised as refugees and are in possession of a permit issued in terms of the Refugees Act (No. 130 of 1998), may apply for admission to the school.

The following documents must be submitted as part of the admission application:

- Copies of both parents' passports
- Certified copies of asylum papers or residence permits
- Certified copy of study permit

Children who are not citizens of South Africa, who are not in possession of a study permit and whose parents are not in possession of a permit for temporary or permanent residence issued by the Department of Home Affairs, or whose parents have been recognised as refugees and are in possession of a refugee permit in terms of the Refugees Act (No. 130 of 1998), may apply for admission to the school, provided that all documents showing that parents have taken formal steps to legalise their stay in South Africa be submitted with the admission application.

Application Procedures

The school reserves the right to verify all information and documentation supplied by an applicant for admission and reserves its right to take legal action against any applicant who intentionally provides false information.

The application process will span a duration of three to four days, during which applications will be reviewed in compliance with the admission policy.

Once a student is accepted, all relevant details will be captured on the school database, at which time an electronic invoice for the enrolment fee will be emailed to the person responsible for the payment of fees.

A student is only active as a student of the school once the enrolment fee is paid.

- Enrolment Fee: R2,000 – Paid after acceptance to secure your child's space

- Annual Upfront – Save 5% by paying the full annual fee before 31 January
- Debit Order Facility – For hassle-free, automated payments
